Key Vocabulary	Definition
The Battle of Hastings	The in 1066 which William the Conqueror (leading the Normans) won against Harold II (leading the Anglo-Saxons).
.....	Where parts of a pattern are a mirror image of each other.

Lindisfarne Gospels	Books of the which tell the story of Jesus (The Gospels) and which were written out and decorated by a monk at Lindisfarne.
.....	A thick piece of cloth made by weaving threads together. Contains patterns and sometimes pictures.
embroidery
.....	A piece of writing written by hand, rather than being typed or printed.
