

Daily Maths Lessons	Daily English and Phonics
<p>Monday: Number of the week : 4 This week we will be learning all about the number 4. Watch these videos to get started.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HzlfPXwy1YY</p> <p>Have a look through your toy vehicles. Do any of them have 4 wheels? Count carefully. Do any of them have a different number of wheels?</p>	<p>Monday: Listen to the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQK-Sm1YY</p>  <p>The illustration shows a caterpillar with a large head and many segments, each with a different food item on it. <p>Tuesday: Learn about 4 with the number blocks https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Xket7YPSCYk</p> <p>Go on a number hunt around your house looking for the number 4.</p>	<p>Tuesday: Listen to the story again: 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQK-Sm1YY</p> <p>This time talk to your grown up about the days of the week. What did The Very Hungry Caterpillar eat on Tuesday? On which day does The Very Hungry Caterpillar eat a pear?</p>
<p>Wednesday: Watch again-</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HzlfPXwy1YY</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Xket7YPSCYk</p> <p>Ask a grown up or older sibling to make you a big number 4 road! This could be with chalk, tape or on paper. Choose a vehicle to drive along the road to practise writing the number 4.</p> 	<p>Wednesday: Today listen to the story again and answer some questions about the story with your grown up.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What food does The Very Hungry Caterpillar eat?• What are your favourite foods?• What colour is each kind of food that appears in The Very Hungry Caterpillar?• What colour food do you like to eat?
<p>Thursday: Learn about 4 with Ten town. (Login) Listen to Freddie Four's story and his Song.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What does Freddie Four like to do?	<p>Thursday: Can you draw a picture of the foods the Very Hungry Caterpillar eats?</p> <p>Ask a grown up to help you label them.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What things does King One make sure Freddie four takes four sets of? • What does Freddie Four take when he goes to hot place? <p>Game: Play Freddie Four's 'more or less' game and 'Desert Island Adventure'.</p> <p>Activity: Find the sets (Login to Ten Town)</p>	
<p>Friday: Practise writing the number 4. Write in the air, write it outside with some chalk. Don't forget the rhyme- 'Down, across, oar in the water'.</p> <p>Game: Freddie Four's number tracing game. (Login to Ten Town)</p>	<p>Friday: Can you draw the journey of the Very Hungry Caterpillar as it begins from the egg on the leaf, to caterpillar, then cocoon and finally as it becomes a Butterfly.</p>

Daily Phase 1 Listening & Attention Tasks

Monday: Watch the video <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=iBKsh-duJDg> Can you sing along?! What do you notice about the sounds in the words you are saying? Can you think of any other words that start with 'p'? Have a look around your house and garden to see what you can find. Perhaps you could even put on your favourite song and make your own song and dance with lots of 'p' sounds!

Tuesday: Watch the video <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zXqEty5dA1Y> Can you make your own silly soup? Choose any sound you like, maybe the sound your name begins with. What will you put in? Remember, it can be as silly as you like!

Wednesday: Make your own alien or monster. You could draw it, make it from playdough, paint it, use junk modelling – anything! Now the fun part is to think of its name! It can be made up and again, very silly but it must start with the same sounds. For example; Ziggy Zoggy Zoo or Timmy Tommy Tee!

Thursday: Today I want you to name your vehicles! Collect up a selection of toy vehicles from around the house – car, train, van, bike and give each one a new silly name! Again, the name must start with the same sound. For example Cally Car, Tommy Train, Bertie Bike. You could even do this with the names of members of your family!

Friday: Finish the week with practising some tongue twisters!

Daily Ongoing Activities

- Daily name practice – Trace over your name and also practice copying your name.
- Daily oral counting practice – Count forwards to 10 and backwards from 10. Which number comes before 3 and after 3?”

- Daily weather forecast – what is the weather like today?
- Daily story – share a book together.

Additional Practical Activities

- Play I spy – “I spy with my little eye something beginning with ...”
- Where is teddy? In the lounge – Adult to put a toy under/on top/next to/behind/in front of a piece of furniture. Can you say where the teddy is?
- Fred Talk – Give the child instructions to follow but segment the doing word. Eg Put on your c-o-a-t. T-a-p your head. P-a-t your head. S-i-t down.
- In the garden/an outdoor space – Using sticks make numbers


Weekly Fine Motor Activities
