Daily Maths Lessons

Daily English Lessons

Monday: Number of the week : 6 This week we will be learning all about the number 6. Watch this video to get started.

This time talk to your grown up about what happens in the story in your own words. Can you look at the pictures and retell the story?

Wednesday: Watch the number blocks.

Do you have a dice at home? Maybe you have a giant one to use in the garden? Or one in a 'popper' as part of a game? Can you count the spots on each side of your dice? Play a game where you roll the dice then someone must do that many jumps/hops/claps or whatever you choose!

Wednesday: Today listen to the story again and answer some questions about the story with your grown up.

- What did the first little pig build his out of?
- What did the Second little pig build his out of?
- What did the third little pig build his out of?
- What did the wolf want to do?
- What happened to the wolf at the end?
- Can you remember what the third little pig did?

Thursday: Learn about 6 with Ten town. (Login)
Listen to Seal Six's story and his Song.

- Where does Seal Six live?
- How many times did Seal Six throw the beach ball in the air?
- How many times did Seal Six splash King One?

Game: Play Seal Six's 'more or less' game and Fish Flipping Game.

Thursday: Can you draw a picture of your favourite part of the story. Talk about what you have drawn with your grown up.

<p>Activity: Find the sets (Login to Ten Town)</p>	
<p>Friday: Practise writing the number 6. Write in the air, write it outside with some chalk. Don't forget the rhyme- 'Slide down his tail, under his nose, nearly there strike a pose.' Game: Seal Six's number tracing game. (Login to Ten Town)</p>	<p>Friday: If you were going to build a house what would it look like? Can you draw your house?</p>

Daily Phase 1 Listening & Attention Tasks

<p>Monday: Grown ups – Oral segmenting is the opposite of oral blending that you did last week. This time the children say the sounds in 'robot talk'. It is the precursor to writing and spelling. Again, it requires no letter recognition at this stage, just careful listening. It too can be tricky for the children at first so they may require lots of praise and encouragement - make it fun! They will be copying the 'fred talk' you modelled last week and will most likely love taking on the role of the robot. If you made a robot last week, now is the perfect time to use it! Have a look at this video for information and examples of oral segmenting in action, then choose one of the games to have a go at. The games at the start of the video are the ones that will be most suitable for Nursery children but choose the ones you feel suit your child the best. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=F5PqB-ndqkU (This video is for grown ups to watch so you can help your child)</p>
<p>Tuesday: Have a picnic and invite a special toy/teddy. Your toy can only understand 'robot talk' so you will all need to speak to them in your robot voice. For example 'Would you like a b-u-n?' 'Here is a r-e-d plate'. Grown ups – Throughout this week's activities, keep modelling your robot talk too. Take turns or do it together and keep it fun. Using words with 2 or 3 sounds, 4 at the most is best whilst your child is getting the hang of this skill.</p>

Wednesday: Play I-Spy with your vehicles. Collect a selection of vehicles. Examples would be v-a-n c-ar b-u-s t-r-ai-n b-o-a-t Say 'I-Spy with my little eye a b-u-s' and the other person must pick up the correct vehicle. Now swap over and the other person has a go. Grown ups - Its always best to have the objects or pictures in front of the children for help and inspiration!

Thursday: Talk about a trip to the farm!(If you have been) Or you could use toy animals, photos, cards from a game you already have or maybe even draw your own! Good ones would be P-i-g C-ow Sh-ee-p G-oa-t D-u-ck C-a-t D-o-g H-e-n Take it in turns to say 'I went to the farm and I saw a p-i-g and the other person has to find the animal you are saying.

Friday: Bath time fun! Before your bath, choose some items that your grown up tells you are ok to take in the bath. Examples would be D-u-ck F-i-sh Sh-ar-k C-u-p D-o-ll T-e-d You will also need a sieve. Take it in turns to tell the other person to 'Go fish for a c-u-p' and they must scoop the correct item out with the sieve. This could also be played in a paddling pool or in a bowl or bucket of water.

Daily Ongoing Activities

- Daily name practice – Trace over dots and also practice copying your name.
- Daily oral counting practice – Count forwards to 10 and backwards from 10. "tell me a bigger/smaller number than 3".

- Daily weather forecast – what is the weather like today?
- Daily story – share a book together.

Additional Practical Activities

- Play I spy – “I spy with my little eye something beginning with ...”
- In the kitchen – Look for numbers on packets and tins in the cupboard. Try and write them.
- Metal Mike – Put out 5 cvc objects in front of the child eg tin, box, fork, can, pen. Adult to segment a word to say ie “t”-“i”-“n” for the child to identify and find.
- In the garden/an outdoor space – Using stones and sticks for practical addition – “3 stones and 2 sticks make?”

Weekly Fine Motor Activities

Draw different lines on a paper for your child to cut out to strengthen their scissor control.



Provide your child different items they can practice their threading skills. This can include, buttons, beads, pasta etc. You can use wool, string or old shoe laces.
