
Daily Maths Lessons

Monday: Number of the week : 8 This week we will be learning all about the number 8. Watch this video to get started.

Ask a grown up to help you make a spider's body. Then ask if you can use 8 pegs to make the legs! Make sure you return the pegs when you are finished!



Daily English Lessons

Make a paper octopus, making sure you give him 8 tentacles! Count to make sure you are correct. You could even finger paint the correct amount onto each tentacle to practise your counting.


This time talk to your grown up about what happens in the story in your own words. Can you look at the pictures and retell the story?

Wednesday: Watch again-

Make a collection of objects; could be sticks, stones, Lego blocks, pasta – anything! Take it in turns to ask

Wednesday: Today listen to the story again and answer some questions about the story with your grown up.

- Who made the Gingerbread man?

<p>the other person to count out a number of objects up to 8. You could use a dice or number cards to generate a number if you like.</p> <p>Grown ups - Counting out from a larger group is harder for children then counting a given group. Start by asking your child to give you small amounts - don't be surprised if they give you a handful! (Login) Listen to Eric Eight's story and his Song.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How many snow balls is Eric Eight made up of? • How many snowballs for his head and how many for his body? • Which eight winter sports does he like? <p>Game: Eric Eight's 'more or less' game.</p> <p>Activity: Find the sets (Login to Ten Town)</p>	<p>Thursday: Can you draw a story map of the story showing what happens at the beginning, middle and end?</p>  <p>The story map is titled 'Story Map: The Gingerbread Man'. It shows a sequence of events connected by red arrows: 1. A man in a blue coat bakes a gingerbread man. 2. The gingerbread man runs away, saying 'Run, run...'. 3. A dog chases him. 4. A cow chases him. 5. A horse chases him. 6. A fox chases him. 7. The gingerbread man is eaten by the fox. There are also small icons of a river and a boat.</p>
<p>Friday: Practise writing the number 8.</p> <p>Write in the air, write it outside with some chalk. Don't forget the rhyme- 'All the way round don't you stop not until your back to the top'. Game: Eric Eight's number tracing game. (Login to Ten Town)</p>	<p>Friday: Can you bake a gingerbread man? This is a really good calming game and will help your child notice the world around him/her and be in the present. You could play the game again and this time notice 5 things that you hear instead.

Daily Ongoing Activities

- Daily name practice – Trace over your name and also practice copying your name.
- Daily number writing practice 1-10.
- Daily oral counting practice – Count forwards to 10 and backwards from 10. Which number is less than 6?"
- Daily weather forecast – what is the weather like today?
- Daily story – share a book together.

- Play I spy – "I spy with my little eye something beginning with ...m, a,s,d,t"
- In the kitchen – Look for numbers on packets and tins in the cupboard. Try and write them.
- Metal Mike – Put out 4 cvc objects in front of the child eg tin, box, can, pen. Adult to segment a word to say ie "t"- "i"- "n" for the child to identify and find. Encourage your child to repeat the segmented word back to you.


- Using letters can you make these simple words – mat, man, dog, mod, cod, cog.
- In the garden/an outdoor space – Using stones, make a long caterpillar and a short caterpillar. Can you make one that is longer than the short one and shorter than the long one?
