

<p><b>Monday:</b> Number of the week : 9</p> <p>This week we will be learning all about the number 9. Watch this video to get started.</p> <p><a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=h-7L6OHT0iE">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=h-7L6OHT0iE</a></p> <p>Go on a number hunt around your house or on a walk outside looking for the number 9.</p> <p>Make a collection of 9 objects (pasta, lego, teddies etc) and look at different ways you can divide the group. 3 teddies on the sofa, 3 on the floor and 3 on the rug. 1 piece of pasta in each section of a muffin tin 2 Lego towers – can you make them the same height? Can we share 9 equally? What happens if you add 1 more object?</p>	<p><b>Monday:</b> 'Jack and the Beanstalk'</p> <p><a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=W5rxflRgXRE">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=W5rxflRgXRE</a></p>  <p>Talk to your grown up about what happens in the story.</p>
<p><b>Tuesday:</b></p> <p>Can you make, draw, paint or design an emergency vehicle? When it's finished, label it with the number 999. This may prompt a discussion about what we may need to do in an emergency.</p> 	<p><b>Tuesday:</b> Listen to the story again: 'Jack and the Beanstalk'</p> <p><a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=W5rxflRgXRE">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=W5rxflRgXRE</a></p> <p>This time talk to your grown up about what happens in the story in your own words. Can you look at the pictures and retell the story?</p>
<p><b>Wednesday:</b> Watch the number blocks.</p> <p><a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XohzkDMAq5k">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=XohzkDMAq5k</a></p> <p>Ask a grown up or older sibling to chalk large number 9's on the floor outside. Can you cycle, scooter or roller skate around the number, carefully following the outline?</p>	<p><b>Wednesday:</b> Today listen to the story again and answer some questions about the story with your grown up.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• What did Jack's mum ask him to do?</li><li>• Was she happy when he came back from the market? Why?</li><li>• What happened when Jack woke up the next morning?</li></ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What did he do next?</li> <li>• Who was at the top of the beanstalk?</li> <li>• What did Jack do next?</li> </ul>
<p><b>Thursday:</b> Learn about 9 with Ten town. (Login) Listen to Nina Nine's story and her Song.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What does Nina Nine do in ten town?</li> <li>• How many diggers does she have?</li> <li>• What other things does she have nine of?</li> </ul> <p><b>Game:</b> Play Nina Nine's 'more or less' game.</p> <p><b>Activity:</b> Find the sets (Login to Ten Town)</p>	<p><b>Thursday:</b> Can you draw a story map of the story showing what happens at the beginning, middle and end?</p> <p>(See below)</p> 

<p><b>Friday:</b> Practise writing the number 9.</p> <p>Write in the air, write it outside with some chalk. Don't forget the rhyme- 'Round her head and back to the start, down her back she's so smart'.</p> <p><b>Game:</b> Nina Nine's number tracing game. (Login to Ten Town)</p>	<p><b>Friday:</b> Can you draw what you might find at the top of your beanstalk if you were to throw some magic beans and saw a beanstalk out of your window?</p>

- Daily story – share a book together.

## Additional Practical Activities


- Play I spy – “I spy with my little eye something beginning with ...e, u, r, f, b, l
- In the kitchen – Look for letters on packets and tins in the- Can you recognise any?
- Metal Mike – Put out 4 CVC objects in front of the child e.g. tin, box, can, pen. Adult to segment a word to say ie “t”-“i”-“n” for the child to identify and find. Encourage your child to repeat the segmented word back to you.

- Using letters can you make these simple words – red, mud, get, neck, duck, sun, ten, run.
- In the garden/an outdoor space – Using stones, make a spiral and count the number of stones you have used.

## Weekly Fine Motor Activities



Thread some string/wool through an old basket and put some plastic toys or scrunch up some paper and encourage your child to pick them up using a peg.



Draw some patterns on strips of paper and encourage your child to hold the scissors correctly and cut along the patterns as carefully as they can.
