VE Day 75th Anniversary

On April 30, 1945, Berlin was surrounded and the Nazi leader Adolf Hitler committed suicide. His successor, Grand Admiral Karl Donitz, then looked to negotiate an end to the war with the Allies.

On May 8, 1945, it was announced by Winston Churchill, Britain's Prime Minister at the time, that the war in Europe was over. Crowds flocked to landmarks like Trafalgar Square and Buckingham Palace - which was damaged in the war - where King George VI, his wife Queen Elizabeth and Winston Churchill greeted them from the balcony. Not everyone celebrated VE Day. For those who had lost loved ones, it was a time to reflect.

The day became known as Victory In Europe (VE) Day, with the 75th anniversary being celebrated today. With lockdown still in effect, this year's VE Day celebrations will be held at home. As there will be lots of news and TV coverage of these historic events, it presents a tremendous learning opportunity for children. Please encourage them to access the VE Day learning materials in the home learning resources that are posted weekly to the COVID-19 section of the school website.

School Return Speculation

There has been much speculation in the press recently around the return of pupils or groups of pupils to school. This has unfortunately only added to the anxieties of many who have been juggling work commitments with home schooling, and continuing to run a household against a backdrop of the 'new normal'.

The Department for Education (DfE) released the following statement yesterday, 7 May 2020:

'Education Secretary Gavin Williamson has not set a date for schools reopening. Schools will remain closed, except for children of critical workers and vulnerable children, until the scientific advice indicates it is the right time to reopen and the five tests set out by Government to beat this virus have been met. We are also working closely with the sector as we consider how to re-open schools, nurseries and colleges and will ensure everyone has sufficient notice to plan and prepare.'

FSM Vouchers/Edenred

We have received an update from the DfE stating that there was a 'significant breakthrough in new enhancements and developments to the systems of Edenred. The capacity for more schools and parents/carers to be able to access and use the system at any one time has been increased; as a result, queue times are expected to be substantially shorter.'

One of the main reason's vouchers have not been received is invalid and unused email addresses.
