

Daily Maths Lessons	Daily English and Phonics
<p>Monday: Number of the week : 2 This week we will be learning all about the number 2. Watch this video to get started.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=fAmAWQ_TTM</p>	<p>Monday: Listen to the story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0gyI6ykDwds</p>  <p>Talk to your grown up about what happens in the story.</p>
<p>Tuesday: Help with the washing! Can you help pair the socks up? What else can you find in the house that comes in 2's?</p> <p>Go on a number hunt around your house looking for the number 2.</p>	<p>Tuesday: Listen to the story again: 'We're going on a Bear Hunt'</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0gyI6ykDwds</p> <p>This time talk to your grown up about what happens in the story. Which different places do the children go through before they get to the cave? Can you name and remember some of the places? How do you think they felt as they went on the Bear Hunt?</p>
<p>Wednesday: Watch again-</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=fAmAWQ_TTM</p> <p>Use Lego, pasta, raisins, sticks – anything! Can you count out 2?</p> <p>Ask a grown up to help you cut out a simple ladybird or butterfly outline. Use finger paint/crayons to add 2 spots to each side, counting aloud as you do.</p>	<p>Wednesday: Today Read the story again and answer some questions about the story with your grown up.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Can you describe the grass?• What noise did the swirling whirling snowstorm make?• One shiny wet nose! / Two big furry ears! / Two big goggly eyes!" - what have they found?• Where were the family at the end of the story?• Do you think they will go on a Bear Hunt again? Why?
<p>Thursday: Learn about 2 with Ten town. (Login)</p> <p>Listen to Tommy Two's story and his Song.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• What is Tommy Two's Job?• What does Tommy Two enjoy doing in twos?• How does Tommy Two sometimes get into a muddle?	<p>Thursday: Can you draw a picture of your favourite setting from the story and talk about what you have drawn with your grown up.</p>

Game: Play Tommy Two's 'more or less' and 'matching pairs' game.	
Activity: Find the sets (Login to Ten Town)	
Friday: Practise writing the number 2. Write in the air, write it outside with some chalk. Don't forget the rhyme- 'Hands round to knees and straight across please?'.	Friday: Can you write a list of places you might have to go through if you were going on a Bear Hunt.

Daily Phase 1 Listening & Attention Tasks

Can you think of some sounds and actions to go with the rhyme?

Tuesday: Ask a grown up or older sibling to read you a story. Together use your voices to add sound effects; maybe a ticking clock or a car engine?

Thursday: Listen to a retelling of 'Peace at Last' by Jill Murphy and use your voice to add the sound effects. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=9U9y35kWBvM>

Friday: Play an animal themed guessing game. Make some sound effects for different animal noises and ask someone to guess what animal you are!

Daily Ongoing Activities

- Daily name practice – Trace over your name and also practice copying your name.
- Daily oral counting practice – Count forwards to 10 and backwards from 10.
- Daily weather forecast – what is the weather like today?
- Daily story – share a book together.

Additional Practical Activities

- Play I spy – “I spy with my little eye something beginning with ...”
- In the Kitchen – Count the number of knives, forks and spoons in the drawer. Practical addition – How many knives and forks are there? How many forks and spoons are there? (work with numbers to 10).
- Make collections of objects with names beginning with the same sound. Create a song, such as ‘What have we got in our sound box today?’ and then show the objects one at a time. Emphasise the initial sound (e.g. s-s-snake, s-s-s-sock, s-s-s-sausage)
- In the garden/an outdoor space – Find three sticks and order them by length. Which is long/short/longest/shortest?

Weekly Fine Motor Activities

Can you thread pasta on to straws or string?



Draw a pattern for your child and ask them to place buttons or coins and follow the pattern.
