Weekly Phonics/Spellings Task

Watch the Read Write Inc phonics lesson daily which will be streamed lived [here](#) at 9.30am and again at 12.30pm for Set 1 and 10am and again at 1pm for Set 2.

Day 1:

Log on to Phonics Play using the username: **march20** and password: **home**.
Play the phase [Rocket Rescue](#) game.

Day 2:

Play the phase 2 [Dragons Den](#) blending game.
Encourage your child to 'Fred Talk' any words they cannot read from sight.

Day 3:

Read and write this week's spelling words: make, saw, day, from, are. Remember to use the usual format: read, write, cover, check. (Page 8)

Day 4:

Play phase 2 [Picnic on Pluto](#). Ask your child to 'Fred Talk' any words they cannot read from sight.

Day 5: Test your child on this week's spelling words. Say the words and ask your child to write it down. Then show the word (one word at a time) and ask your child to read the word. Practice forming the lower case letters of the alphabet. Then encourage your child to write a simple sentence using this week's spelling words: make, saw, day, from, are. (Page 8)

Weekly Reading Task

Day 1:

Before reading [The Toys Party](#) discuss the front cover with your child. Ask: what do you think this story will be about? Write down your predictions. We know it's about a party, so ask: what do you like to eat at a party? Once you have done this begin to read the story. Encourage your child to use their phonics for words they cannot read from sight. Ask your child to think about any words in the text that they do not understand.

Day 2:

Encourage your child to recall yesterday's story. Listen to [The Toys Party](#) this time. Encourage your child to use their phonic knowledge to write a list of party food.

Day 3:

Today focus on [page 14](#). Ask: why was mum cross? Then move on to page 6, compare the toys facial expressions from page 6 to page 10. What is the difference? Why are they looking unhappy on page 10?


Day 4:

Listen to the story [The Snail and the Whale](#). As you are reading ask your child to predict what might happen next? Ask your child to join in with the story. What is happening in the story? Where is the story based?

Day 5:

Recall the story [The Snail and the Whale](#). Encourage your child to then write a simple sentence to explain what happened. Remember to 'Fred Talk' each word.

Gross motor skills



Learning Project- to be completed throughout the week: How the Olympic games begun.

This project should be completed throughout the week. It will incorporate a range of different subjects and topics. The focus this week is to know and understand how and where the Olympic games begun.

Day 1

A long time ago, in Olympia, Greece people from all over Greece would come together every four years to watch and take part in the Olympic Games. The Olympic Games were held to in honour of Zeus, the king of Gods. Thousands of people would visit the Temple of Zeus. There was a big gold and ivory statue of Zeus inside.

Use the internet to research about the Temple of Zeus. Draw a picture of the statue of Zeus and write sentences about the facts you learn.

Day 2

Let's learn some more about the Ancient Greek Olympic games using this [video](#). Once you have finished learning about the ancient games have a go at drawing a picture of the games that were played and labelling the equipment needed for each game.

Day 3

Use this [website](#) to learn more about the ancient Olympic games. If you were taking part in the Olympic games which game would you want to participate in? Make a poster about this game and draw yourself playing it. Can you research the rules of this game? What equipment is needed to play the game?

Day 4

For our art learning we are going to look at different Olympic game sculptures. A sculpture can be 2D or 3D. Different tools are used to mould the plasticine or clay. Look through the pictures on page 9 and describe what game is being played and the similarities and differences between the sculptures.

Day 5

Today it's time to get creative and make your own Olympic sculpture! You can have a go at making simple air drying clay following this [video](#). You could also make your sculpture using this simple [salt dough recipe](#).

Encourage your child to help you measure the ingredients and make the clay or dough with you. Then ask them to sculpt the dough/ clay into a model of an athlete playing one of the Olympic games. Let your sculpture dry and you could them paint it if you want to.


