Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a delightful first full week back in school. Our children have all made an excellent start back at school and it is wonderful to see the school community again. We are so proud of the way the children have got back into school routines and the great learning behaviours they have displayed. There has been a calm, focused and determined start to the academic year and they all look extremely smart in their new uniforms.

Over the summer break, the school was a hive of activity as the building contractors worked diligently to get as much of the essential works completed over the holiday period as they could. I am grateful to local residents for their patience during these works. Unfortunately, due to national and international supply chain problems, the works have been delayed for a small number of weeks. We are hopeful of moving into the new areas after the half-term break. This means, due to risk assessments in place, parents will still not be able to attend Good Work and Class assemblies for the foreseeable future. We are disappointed to again have to share this news but are hopeful it won't be for long. We will however continue to take photographs and share these on Class Dojo.

Your children are the most important part of our school and working in partnership with families to support their learning will make their time at school both happy and successful. If you have any concerns or questions, please do come and speak with your child's class teacher in the first instance as they are best placed to help. Myself and my two deputies, Mrs Pannu and Mr Matthews, are always available outside on the school playground at the beginning of the day should you wish to meet with us.

We would also like to extend a warm welcome to Miss K Kaur, Class Teacher in Class Y2.1, to Miss R Takhar in Class Y4.2 and to Miss A Virdi in Class Y5.1. I would also like to extend a warm welcome to the William Murdoch Primary School family to all our new children and their parents.



Queen Elizabeth II



I am sure you are aware that the Government has announced the Queen's state funeral is due to take place on **Monday 19 September 2022.** As a mark of respect, this day has been declared a national Bank Holiday. Therefore, school will be closed for both pupils and staff on this day.

We will reopen as normal on Tuesday 20 September 2022 at 8.40am.

The State Funeral of Her Majesty The Queen will take place at Westminster Abbey on Monday 19 September 2022 at 11.00am. A Committal Service at St George's Chapel, Windsor, will take place later the same day at 4.00pm. Presently, The Queen Lies-in-State in Westminster Hall at the Palace of Westminster, having arrived in Procession from Buckingham Palace on Wednesday 14 September 2022.

Her state funeral will be attended by more than 2,000 official guests including the heads of state of many nations, and will end with the last post, a two-minute silence, and a lament played by the Queen's personal piper. Queen Elizabeth II will be buried next to the Duke of Edinburgh at Windsor in a private ceremony attended by her family.

School Meals – Dolce

We are aware a number of parents have received emails from SchoolGrid notifying them that their child's school meal pre-order has been cancelled. We have been informed by Dolce that there were incorrect menu choices published on SchoolGrid, which are being rectified. If you have received an email from SchoolGrid, please login to your child's account and reselect a meal choice for that date. Rest assured, all children affected by cancellations of pre-ordered meals will still receive a school meal.



If you would like your child to receive school meals, this includes Free School Meals, Universal Infant Free School Meals (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) and paid school meals, you will need to set up a SchoolGrid account. All new parents have received an email to set up a SchoolGrid account. I ask that you check your inbox and junk mail folders if you have not yet accessed the email. If you cannot retrieve this link, please email the Main Office at enquiry@williammurdoch.bham.sch.uk and a new one will be sent out to you.

Dolce requires all parents to pre-order their child's meal in advance. This can be done on a weekly or termly basis. This is to help the catering team to prepare the right amount of meals. A reminder,

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where a meal has not been selected by parents, children will receive the default option of a jacket potato. There is no facility to pre-order the sides or dessert options as these are chosen on the day.

Once you have set-up your child's SchoolGrid account, parents must enter all food allergies related to their child and keep this up to date. Once this information has been entered, all meal options with those allergies are greyed out so that you are unable to select that meal choice. If you would like your child to have a vegetarian meal, please select the meal with a (v) next to it. If your child does not eat egg, please either select 'egg' on the allergy list (in this way the meals containing egg will be greyed out and therefore cannot be mistakenly selected) or read the ingredients list (i) next to the meal choice. Please note the meat used in the school meals is not halal.

School Photographs

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Free School Meal Eligibility

The school has implemented a system to accurately record pupils' entitlement to Free School Meals. Please access the following link to register, <u>www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/birmingham/</u>. The school will be notified of all children who qualify for Free School Meals. Even if you are not eligible at present, please complete the application online as you will be notified of your entitlement if your personal circumstances change.



Class Dojo

At William Murdoch Primary School, we use Class Dojo as our remote learning platform. Class Dojo provides a way for children to complete learning online and submit work to their class teacher. As parents, you can see the work set by the class teacher and the completed homework submitted by your child. On the 'Class Story',

you will be able to see latest information and updates. There is also a messaging feature for you to contact your child's class teacher, however this should not be used for sensitive issues, nor for reporting absences. All messages will be responded to within two working days.

If you experience any technical issues, then please contact the Main Office for further assistance.

Lower School



Milo Imagines the World – *Matt de la Peña & Christian Robinson* (illustrator)

A young boy people-watches on a monthly subway journey, speculating and sketching about their lives. The destination is initially unknown to readers, although a sense of an impending, suspenseful climax builds from the start.

This picture book provides a wonderful launch pad for readers from Key Stage One onwards to consider how we 'read the world' and how perceptions can be altered through viewing individuals in their complicated

totality. The book was awarded the Josette Frank Award (2022) by the Bank Street Children's Book Committee for a work of outstanding literary merit for young readers.

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Upper School

Race to the Frozen North – Catherine Johnson

Matthew Henson was simply an ordinary man. That was, until Commander Robert E. Peary entered his life and offered him a chance at true adventure. Henson would become navigator, craftsman, translator and right-hand man on a treacherous journey to the North Pole. Race to the Frozen North tells the remarkable story of Matthew Henson, the first man to reach the North Pole. A little luck and a lot of hard work led to a life of adventure for Henson on the high seas and in the Arctic but back home in America, his achievements were ignored due to the colour of his skin.

Written in simple, easy-to-read language, this is accessible historical fiction that will appeal to readers of all abilities.

Celebrating Queen Elizabeth II through Artwork

This week the children have been creating artwork in recognition of the life and service of Queen Elizabeth II. In addition to this, time was also spent exploring lots of work by other artists focussing mainly on portraits of Queen Elizabeth II and paintings of various royal buildings.


Different year groups were tasked with creating artwork along different themes. EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 created silhouettes of crowns that were then decorated in an appropriate and thoughtful manner. Year 3 and Year 4 cut out silhouettes of Queen Elizabeth II's portrait and added detail in order to form a necklace and a crown. Finally, Year 5 and Year 6 created silhouettes of Buckingham Palace and put lots of thought into how best to place a wide variety of different shapes in order to create a successful image.

> A selection of the work created is going to be shown on displays around the school and shall act as a reminder of the amazing life Queen Elizabeth II lived and the significant impact on history that she had.

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






Pupil of the Week
