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


Dolce Menu

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
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Mr Slinn's Artists of the Week

How Winston Came Home for Christmas- Alex T. Smith

There's no feeling quite like cosying up with the next instalment of a much-loved story and Alex T. Smith's Winston books offer an almost month-long delight of a festive tale. A cross between a Christmas story and an advent calendar, the Winston books are charming full-colour hardbacks structured into 24½ chapters — one for each day of advent. Each day's offering includes the next chapter of the story and easy-to-follow instructions for an accompanying craft to make or activity to try. How Winston Came Home for Christmas is the second Winston story and follows Winston the mouse on a quest to find a long-lost friend. Themes of kindness, connecting with loved ones, recovering what is lost and valuing friendships abide - all perfect for Christmas time - and the daily activities range from art and baking to giving gifts to others and finding out about festive traditions from different cultures. This is a gorgeous gift book that will be treasured year after year as a treasured festive tradition for young readers.
