Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you are continuing to enjoy the good weather. Our Reception children completed their first full week. The children have all settled in fantastically well and have been busy discovering lots of new exciting things including taking part in Forest School. It has been lovely to see them getting to know each other and growing in confidence throughout the week! We hope that everyone soon feels settled and part of the school family here at William Murdoch.

It has been another busy week with a multitude of learning activities taking place each day including the instrumental instruction of violin, guitar, brass and sitar to name a few. Before and after school clubs are also in full swing. We have a number of intervention strategies in place to support pupils in their learning with the school offering 1:1 or small group tutoring through Department for Education approved agencies.

We have spent thousands of pounds on upgrading library books in both the Lower School and Upper School libraries. Reading activities permeate all curriculum areas and we use every opportunity to develop a reading culture. We ask that children spend at least half an hour each day reading in order to develop a reading habit. I cannot overstate the importance of reading. It develops stronger analytical skills, expands the vocabulary as well as improving your child's ability to focus and concentrate.

Did you know that if you read for 20 minutes a day, you'll read 1,800,000 words per year?


School Meals Pre-Ordering Reminder

There has been an increased number of parents who have contacted the Main Office this week enquiring as to why their child has received a jacket potato on a daily basis. The reason for this is because there has been no pre-ordered meal. Dolce requires all parents to pre-order their child's meal. This can be done on a weekly or termly basis. If you fail to pre-order your child's meal, they will receive the default option of a jacket potato. COVID-19 UPDATE

Following a review of our COVID-19 Outbreak Management Plan, we have made the decision to ask that children who are awaiting a PCR result, because they have had close contact with a positive case **within their household**, remain at home until the PCR test result comes back. Once the result is received, we ask that you ring us for further advice on how to proceed. Although this is slightly different from government guidelines, Public Health England have said they will support schools making this decision, in order to minimise the risk of the spread of infection in schools. If the close contact is from outside the household, children can be in school whilst waiting for their PCR result. We really appreciate your co-operation with this decision.

Although the Department for Education guidance asks schools to only inform parents if our numbers of positive cases reach the thresholds of 5 or more children in one class, or more than 10% of a group of close contacts, I have taken the decision to always keep you informed of every positive case in the setting. This will be carried out as a "Warn and Inform" service, so parents can be more mindful of potential symptoms in their children.

Safety Measures

Although we are trying to get as close to 'normal' as we can, we are still continuing with caution and maintain a number of safety measures in school in order to keep the children and staff as safe as we can:

- Both children and staff are still handwashing/hand-sanitising at regular intervals throughout the day
- Classrooms and communal areas are well ventilated
- We are strictly limiting the amount of mixing across whole year group sets inside the school
- Touch point cleaning continues throughout the day, with cleaning of regularly touched surfaces such as door handles, bannisters, hand rails and other surfaces
- We make use of quarantine rooms in case children display COVID-19 symptoms whilst in school
- Staff are being asked to test for COVID-19 using Lateral Flow Tests twice weekly and report their results to the NHS


If your child or anyone in your family has possible COVID-19 symptoms, please do not send them to school and get a PCR test as soon as possible. You need to inform the school of the result so that we can take any actions needed and make sure we are following government guidance. If you are unsure, please call the Main Office for advice.

Upper School


Malamander – Thomas Taylor


Set in present time, together with the map at the front of the book and the descriptive language, it creates the illusion that it is a narrative set in the past and draws the reader in straight away.

Mr Slinn's Artists of the Week




Taranveer Y1.3

The children in Year 1 have been learning about the artist Mondrian during their unit of work based on colour.


Taranveer was able to create a fantastic piece of work inspired by this artist. It was great to see the primary colours being used so well!
