Weekly Maths Tasks

Day 1: MONDAY

Day 4: THURSDAY

Weekly Writing Task

Day 1: MONDAY

Write a letter to Farmer Hogget (from The Sheep Pig book) suggesting ways to keep his animals safe during this difficult time.

Day 2: TUESDAY

Having thought about the different ending for your favourite fairy tale in the reading task today – now write your version from beginning to end in your YB.

Day 3: WEDNESDAY

Create an unusual looking 'being' to be friends with the character from today's reading clip. Draw it in your YB and write a character description for it.

Day 4: THURSDAY

In your YB write a short story based on the character you created yesterday, wandering through the woods, discovering something exciting there and writing what happens...

Day 5: FRIDAY

In your YB write about an interesting building you have found out about and write a list of questions you would like to ask about it.

Learning Project- to be completed throughout the week: My Local Area

Alongside working on your People in History Project, this is a separate project which should be completed throughout the week.

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for you to learn more about the area in which you live in. Learning may focus on your local area, famous people, key landmarks and links to your city.

Let's Wonder:

Think about your street. What type of houses are on there? What type of house do you live in? What other buildings are close by? Find out about your local area, what different buildings does it have? How old are some of those buildings? How have they changed over time? Use a map to locate different places. Look on [Google Earth](#). Draw your own map of your local area.

Let's Create:

Choose a building you most admire in your local area. Make a model of that building using materials you have on hand e.g. playdough, [junk modelling](#), lego etc. How well did you do? What would you do differently next time? What have you learnt?

Be Active:

If you can and it is safe, get out into the garden, pull up some weeds or mow the lawn? Does the garden need a tidy up? Maybe you could plant some seeds. (***Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week***).

Time to Talk:

Were your family members all born in this local area? If not, how is their place of birth different to your own local area? If they were, how different is the local area since they were born? Talk about their memories of how it has changed.

Understanding Others and Appreciating Differences:

Research different places of worship that can be found in the local area. Where is the nearest Church? Mosque? Synagogue? Temple? Gurdwara? What can you find out about them? Draw pictures and label them with any information you find out.

Reflect:

Think about what would improve your local area? What is your local area lacking? What spoils your local area? What could be done?
