Encourage your child not to think about what they know about the story. They should write from this point on a different version of the story. They can combine different fairy tales if they want to be creative.</p>	<p>Your child will now explore what alphabetical order is. Get them to recite the alphabet. Your child should now watch this video to help them. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/topics/zxfjty/articles/zcyfsg8</p> <p>They must now write out the alphabet going down the page:</p> <p>a b c d Etc.</p> <p>Then they must look through their favourite book and try and find a word that begins with each letter of the alphabet.</p>

Weekly Science Tasks

Complete the 'What is the Weather?' exercise on **Pages 6 and 7** in your CGP Science books.

You can discuss any points further with your child. Get them to think about the weather that we had last week (Thunderstorms). Your child can do further research if wanted.

Weekly Phonics Tasks

Day 1:

Think of the different ways of spelling the /ai/ sound. Refer back to the spelling lesson previously learned about Refer to the resource in the additional resources for the /ai/ sound spelt -ay- 'May I play'. Get your child to write down the real -ay words and the fake -ay words.
Can they think of anymore -ay real words and make up some fake -ay words?

Day 2:

Get your child to think of the sound /ee/ 'What can you see?' Encourage your child to read a book, whether it is their reading book or another book suitable for their age. They should identify words with the /ee/ sound in and write them down. As a challenge they should write down any words they know with the /ee/ sound in and put them into a sentence.

Day 3:

Your child must play on this game and identify words that are real 'Bob' and fake 'Obb'. They can identify special friends in the word if needed to help them read the words. Work through all the phases and complete the mixed sounds.

Day 4:

Your child should complete Art Knowledge Organiser Quiz on Architecture and Sculpture.


Recently there has been a special rocket launch into space. Your child might have seen it on the news. Here's a video that will tell your child all about Space X:

How cool is it?! Now your child must imagine that they are going on a mission to space. However, they can't go to space without a rocket.

Using the template below, your child should be as creative as they be when designing it. They can even make a rocket with a water bottle or a cardboard tube (google for instructions)

Rocket template:



Your child has previously learned about space and they were lucky enough to have a virtual reality experience learning about the planets. Ask your children what they know about the planets.

They should now use their imagination to create a 'new' planet they found whilst they went up to space in their rocket. Your child should draw a picture of it and decorate it. Then they should write a description of their planet- using their 5 senses to help when describing it.
