Day 1:


Day 4:

Your child should think of 10 different numbers between 0-50 and write them down. They should then identify how many tens and ones they have in them.

Your child should design an alternative front cover for their home reader book.

Weekly Phonics/Spellings Task

Day 1:

All of the words for this week's spellings contain 2 syllables. A syllable is a part of words- we can find out how many syllables a word has by clapping it.

For example:

Book has only 1 syllable

Pil-low has 2 syllables

Shut-tle-cock has 3 syllables.

Your child should be able to read these words:

Zebra

Kitten

Parrot

Jumper

Butter

Yellow

Weekly Writing Task

Day 1:

After listing all the adjectives to describe the owls, your child should create a missing poster for one of the owls imagining they have gone missing.

Your child should remember to mainly describe the owl's appearance rather than personality.

Day 2:

Your child has learned about verbs (a doing word).

They should think of alternative verbs for these words:

Walk

Cry

Run

Talk

<p>Chicken Pocket Hamster Spotty</p> <p><u>Day 2:</u> Watch the online live set 2 phonics. Either 10:00 am or 1:00 pm. Your child should join in with the sounds when they are read. https://www.ruthmiskin.com/en/</p> <p><u>Day 3:</u> Reviewing day 1 spellings, your child should try to spell these words- using the read, write, cover and check format. They can then split the words into syllables using clapping to help them. For example: Kit-ten.</p> <p><u>Day 4:</u> Your child should read some of the alien and real words given in the Learning from Home Phonics pack. They can use 'special friends' and 'Fred talk' to help them if they are finding it difficult.</p> <p><u>Day 5:</u> Using the spellings from day 1, your child should put these spellings into a sentence. They should underline the spelling in the sentence. For example: There was a stripy <u>zebra</u> at the zoo today.</p>	<p>They should then write 4 sentences using some of the different verbs they have thought of.</p> <p><u>Day 3:</u> Your child should think about their favourite storybook. They should write a summary of it, thinking about the key events of the story and writing it in a shortened form.</p> <p><u>Day 4:</u> Your child should read Tom the Tiger again, thinking about all the things that Tom ate. They should then think about making Tom some jam sandwiches. They should write a list of instructions on how they can make jam sandwiches. They can even follow the instructions and make the sandwiches for themselves!</p> <p><u>Day 5:</u> Your child should write out all of the letters of the alphabet- one letter per line. Next to the letter, they should think of an animal that starts with that letter name. For example: A- Ant B- Baboon</p>
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Learning Project- to be completed throughout the week: Animals

This project should be completed throughout the week. It will incorporate a range of different subjects and topics. The focus this week is on different types of animals- ones that can be found in this country and other countries and climates. This project will enable your child to understand more about a range of animals and enable them to attempt to draw them.

What can you see in your garden?
Your child should explore their surroundings. They should look in their garden/local park to see the different types of animals and creatures. They should think about why they might be where your child found them, they should consider if there any animals that they know are there but they can see them, where are they where they are?
They can play this sorting activity to help them identify where the different animals live.

Drawing different animals:
Your child has previously drawn a penguin and has explored what different types of lines are used. Curved, looped, straight, zigzag etc.
They should choose two more animals to draw and follow the video thinking about what lines they are using. Once they have drawn the animals they can then add to the drawing by adding features of the

animal's habitat. They might need to do additional resource to help them with this.


Jack ran in the park.
