Further Learning Opportunities

The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about inspirations, hopes and dreams. It is an opportunity for your child to share their aspirations and hopes they have. Your child will need to complete the activities to support their learning.

Who is your inspiration?

Can you write about who **inspires** you? Who do you look up to? What does that person do that is **special** and makes you **admire** them? In your purple home learning books can you write a paragraph about who inspires you.

For example:

My teacher, Mr Smith inspires me because he is always kind to everyone. He finds the time to listen to each of us and treats us with respect. I like Mr Smith because when I feel that I can't do something he encourages me, then I feel better and will try my best. Mr Smith is the best teacher I have ever had; I will not forget the jokes he made and the games we played. He is so cool! I wish everyone had a teacher like Mr Smith, he is the BEST!

My Mum is my inspiration because she works very hard and no matter how tired she is, she always does her best. She cooks the best food, bakes the most delicious cakes and they really do taste great! Whenever I am hurt, she comforts me and instantly it makes me feel better. She encourages me to work hard and be kind to everyone...

My local fire fighters are my inspiration because they not only put out fires, they save lives. It is a hard job to do but they always to their best. They are apart of the community and share how to keep safe, they also work all hours of the day. I appreciate their help and what they do, they can even rescue pets if they have to!

Remember to include: full stops, capital letters, effective adjectives, commas and noun phrases.

What would you like to be when you grow up?
