Further Learning Opportunities

Project – Board Game

Over the next few weeks, you will be working on researching and creating your own board game. Below are a few steps to help and guide you:

Step 1: Spend some time playing different board games, e.g. Monopoly, Scrabble, Snakes and Ladders.

Step 2: Do some research on board games. Write your research down.

Step 3: Think about your theme, e.g. trains, dragons, princesses.

Step 4: How do you win in this game? E.g. Highest score wins, first to finish wins, elimination.

Step 5: How do you play your game? Write a set of instructions for your game.

Step 6: Create and make your board game!

Step 7: Test your game. Show your family and friends, explain to them what your game is and how to play. You may need to test your game a few times - depending on feedback and your ideas to improve

it.
