#### MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been lovely to have all of our Reception children in full time this week, and experiencing school lunches for the first time too. It's wonderful to see them exploring the learning opportunities available to them both inside and outside the classroom, including venturing into the Forest School. They have been getting to know each other and growing in confidence throughout the week. We hope that everyone soon feels settled and part of the school family here at William Murdoch.

It has been another busy week with a multitude of learning activities taking place each day including the instrumental instruction of violin, guitar, brass and sitar to name a few. Before and after school clubs are also in full swing. We have a number of intervention strategies in place to support pupils in their learning with the school offering 1:1 or small group tutoring.

I spoke this week to parents of Year 1 children about the Phonics Screening Check that the children will be taking at the end of the year and the importance of phonics as one of the foundational building blocks of learning to read. Reading activities permeate all curriculum areas at William Murdoch and we use every opportunity to develop a reading culture. We ask that children spend at least half an hour each day reading in order to develop a reading habit. I cannot overstate the importance of reading. It develops stronger analytical skills, expands the vocabulary as well as improving your child's ability to focus and concentrate.

# Did you know that if you read for 20 minutes a day, you'll read 1,800,000 words per year?

I hope you all have a great weekend and as always, I am available on the playground in the morning and after school if you want to speak to me, or alternatively you can leave a message with the Main Office.

# **Pupil Data Collection Sheets**

Projects have been a long-standing tradition of the school and provide an opportunity for pupils to develop their research, analysing, organisation and presentation skills. It also provides a chance for parents to get involved by helping their child complete their project.

# **UNICEF Article of the Week**

This week, pupils across the school have looked at:

Article 29 (Aims of Education) - Education must develop every child's personality, talents and abilities to the full. It must encourage the child's respect for human rights, as well as respect for their parents, their own and other cultures, and the environment.



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Pupils across the school focused on the question 'How can education support you to develop your personality, talents and abilities?' #### **Breakfast Club**

Breakfast Club is back up and running and we still have a small number of places available. The cost of this provision is £2.50 per day for the first child, and £1.00 per day for any additional children, and must be paid for in advance on a half-termly basis. #### **After-School Clubs**

The school continues to provide an outstanding before and after school club offer. Places will be awarded on a first-come-first-served basis. Pupils who have shown an interest in joining a club will be given a letter for their parents to complete and sign. It should be returned to their class teacher as soon as possible.



## School Meals - ParentPay

From Reception to the end of Year 2, children are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals. From Year 3 upwards the cost of school lunches will be £2.30 per day. Families in receipt of certain benefits may be entitled to means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). If you think you might be eligible and have not yet applied, please contact the school office in confidence, or visit



https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/birmingham for eligibility details and to apply online. Even if your child does not take the free meals up, or is currently having free meals because of their age, his/her entitlement to FSM will attract additional funding to the school. Please do apply if you think you might be eligible.

For children going up to Year 3 from September 2024, please remember that Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) stop at the end of Year 2. The cost of school meals for Year 3 upwards will be £2.30 per day.

We ask that parents settle all Parent Pay outstanding balances by Friday 27 September 2024. We will continue to chase any outstanding payments until they have been paid in full. The school operates a No Debt Policy with regard to school meals, however families are well informed and supported through the process.

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### **Nursery/Reception Places for September 2024**

There remain a limited number of Nursery and Reception places for this academic year. If you have a child (or know of a friend or family member who has a child) who is born between 1/09/2020 and 31/08/2021 (Nursery) or 1/09/2019 and 31/08/2020 (Reception), we strongly encourage you to apply as spaces are strictly limited. We are more than happy to help with completing the application process.

#### **Year 6 Parents - Secondary Transfer Meeting**

To support parents and pupils, answer your questions and explain the process as clearly as possible, a Year 6 Secondary Transfer Meeting has been arranged on **Thursday 3 October 2024** at **9.00am** in the Upper School hall and again at **3.30pm** in the Upper School hall.

## **Class Dojo**

At William Murdoch Primary School, we use Class Dojo as our remote learning platform. Class Dojo provides a way for children to complete learning online and submit work to their class teacher. As parents, you can see the work set by the class teacher and the completed homework submitted by your child. On the 'Class Story', you will be able to see the latest information and updates. There is also a messaging feature for you to contact your child's class teacher; however, this should not be used for sensitive issues, nor for reporting absences. All messages will be responded to within two working days.

#### **WMPS Attendance Stats**

Over a school year, we are due to be open for 190 days, which equates to 380 sessions. Registration takes place at 8.50am in the morning and after lunch in the afternoon. Attendance is affected if a pupil is not present at school for any whole session including registration.

# The Golden Hare – Paddy Donnelly

Meara embarks on an adventure with her grandpa to find the legendary Golden Hare. Guided by Grandad's nature journal, they follow clues and take time to appreciate the natural wonders around them. Along the way, Meara creates her own journals, filled to the brim with drawings, notes, and natural treasures. The shape of the Golden Hare is cleverly hidden on each page - sometimes in the ripples of water, between the trees, or even in the steam rising from a coffee mug. Readers are encouraged to slow down and look closely, discovering new hidden hares with every reread. At the end of the book, informative pages reveal that the Golden Hare is, in fact, a real animal! This story is perfect for inspiring children to explore the outdoors and start their own nature journals.

#### **Looking for Emily – Fiona Longmuir**

Lily has just moved to a rather dull seaside town when she discovers a hidden museum dedicated to a girl named Emily, who vanished mysteriously years ago. Teaming up with new friends, Lily embarks on a quest to uncover the truth behind Emily's disappearance, but her investigation brings numerous dangers. Though it initially flew under the radar, this book is highly recommended and will prove to be a hidden gem. The dual narrative is particularly effective. Lily navigates the present day, piecing together the mystery of Emily, while Emily's own story unfolds from years earlier, as she grapples with a dire situation and evades various threats. Fiona Longmuir weaves the story together flawlessly, incorporating themes of friendship and belonging. Lily and Emily are compelling and authentic characters. This book is an absolute treasure, perfect for any Upper School children.





# Mr Slinn's Artist of the Week




## Zoya - Y5.2
