Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been a wonderful first week back in school. Our children have returned with smiles and have made a great start in their new year groups. It is truly wonderful to see the school community again. We are so proud of the way the children have got back in to school routines and the great learning behaviours they have displayed following the work on our behaviour curriculum. There has been a calm, focused and determined start to the academic year and they all look extremely smart in their new uniforms.

The summer holiday period is a busy time of the year for the school caretakers and the cleaning team. If your query has not been answered to your satisfaction, myself and my two deputies, Mrs Pannu and Mr Matthews, are always available outside on the school playground at the beginning and end of the day should you wish to meet with us.

I would like to extend a warm welcome to Miss S Majid, teacher for Class Y1.2 in Lower School, to Mr C Bentley who is the class teacher in Y4.3 and Miss T Bharth who is the class teacher for Y5.3. I would also like to extend a warm welcome to the William Murdoch Primary School family to all our new children and their parents. Our new Nursery and Reception children have joined us this week and have made such an amazing start. We very much hope that they have enjoyed their first week. It was lovely to see them starting to get to know each other and becoming more confident in their new surroundings during the short time that they have been in.

School Timings

The Department for Education (DfE) announced earlier in the year that all mainstream schools must offer a minimum of 32.5 hours of teaching time each week from September 2024. Therefore, to ensure we meet this criterion, we have had to extend the timings of the school day. The new school timings are as follows:

Group B (Years 2, 4 & 6)	8.40am to 3.25pm

School Photographs

The photographer will be in school on Thursday 12 September 2024 to photograph the children in the Upper School. Family photos will be taken at 8.35am in the Upper School hall. Throughout the day, individual, class and sibling photos will be taken. On Friday 13 September 2024, the photographer will be in school to photograph the children in the Lower School. We will arrange for brothers and sisters in the Upper School and Lower School to be photographed together on either of these days. Please ensure that your child is in full school uniform. If your child has PE and is due to have their photograph taken, they must wear their full school uniform to school and bring their PE kit to school in their bag to change in to.

School photographs for all Nursery pupils will take place on Monday 23 September 2024.

School Meals - ParentPay

From Reception to the end of Year 2, children are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals. From Year 3 upwards the cost of school lunches will be £2.30 per day. Families in receipt of certain benefits may be entitled to means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). If you think you might be eligible and have not yet applied, please contact the school office in confidence, or visit https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/birmingham for eligibility details and to apply online. Even if your child does not take the free meals up, or is currently having free meals because of their age, his/her entitlement to FSM will attract additional funding to the school. Please do apply if you think you might be eligible.

For children going up to Year 3 from September 2024, please remember that Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) stop at the end of Year 2. The cost of school meals for Year 3 upwards will be £2.30 per day.

We ask that parents settle all Parent Pay outstanding balances by Friday 27 September 2024. We will continue to chase any outstanding payments until they have been paid in full. The school operates a No Debt Policy with regard to school meals, however families are well informed and supported through the process.

Termly Newsletters

Your child has been given a physical copy of the termly newsletter which details the topics your child will be covering in each subject this term. It is good practice for children to do some background reading on topics that they will be studying.

Your child will also bring home a credit card-sized card with all the term dates for your convenience.

Over the coming weeks, we will be holding Welcome Meetings for parents so that you can become familiar with the team that is supporting your child, the curriculum being taught, school policies and procedures, and other information that will provide you with a broad insight into what you can expect your child to learn this year. Book Bag Sale

Class Dojo

At William Murdoch Primary School, we use Class Dojo as our remote learning platform. Class Dojo provides a way for children to complete learning online and submit work to their class teacher. As parents, you can see the work set by the class teacher and the completed homework submitted by your child. On the 'Class Story', you will be able to see the latest information and updates. There is also a messaging feature for you to contact your child's class teacher; however, this should not be used for sensitive issues, nor for reporting absences. All messages will be responded to within two working days.

Axel Scheffler's Treasury of Fairy Tales – Axel Scheffler

A collection of beloved fairy tales, illustrated by the iconic Axel Scheffler, known to many young readers through Julia Donaldson's books like The Gruffalo.

This treasury features timeless stories that form the backbone of children's literature, including classics like The Three Little Pigs, Goldilocks and the Three Bears, and Puss in Boots. Additionally, it contains several illustrated nursery rhymes, making it perfect for Nursery children.


Scheffler's illustrations are rich with subtle details that celebrate the role of storytelling, rhyme, and music in our culture. For instance, one of the three little pigs is depicted with headphones, while another enjoys a book. Elsewhere, a hare in a Willy Wonka-style outfit appears, and a woodland scene familiar to Scheffler's fans comes to life. The tales are narrated in simple language with enough repetition and predictability to allow young children to quickly become familiar with them. This book is an essential addition to any home library.

Crook Haven – *J.J Arcanjo*

Gabriel, an adept pickpocket, receives an invitation to Crook Haven, an academy for aspiring thieves. Here, he will master various criminal skills, with the understanding that he must use these talents for the greater good.

JJ Arcanjo's debut novel captivates with its meticulous attention to detail, mirroring the elaborate heists within its pages. Gabriel is a compelling protagonist—complex, fair, and resilient—backed by a vibrant and diverse cast. The novel's core concept, "We teach you to do wrong, so you can one day make things right," brilliantly showcases a range of skills such as hacking, deception, physical agility, and infiltration.



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The novel excels in world-building, richly describing the history of Crook Haven, its distinguished alumni, and the difference between Merits and Legacies. This book is perfect for Upper Key Stage 2 (UKS2) readers.
