
Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you so much to everyone who was able to attend our Welcome Meetings this week. It was lovely to see so many familiar faces alongside those who are new to our community. There was an awful lot of information to take in so please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher or the school office if there is anything you need to double check.

At the start of each meeting, I spoke about the offer you can expect from us for your child during their time in school. This school was created through the amalgamation of Wilkes Green Infant School and Wilkes Green Junior School on 1 May 2019. The school takes its name from the tenacious and talented Scottish engineer, William Murdoch, who alongside James Watt and Matthew Boulton, were at the heartbeat of the industrial revolution. He lived on Queens Head Road and Murdoch Road is named after him. Murdoch was a truly remarkable inventor who never stopped asking questions, solving problems, and imagining new possibilities. From building wooden machines as a child in Scotland to lighting streets with gas and improving steam engines, Murdoch showed that curiosity, creativity, and hard work can change the world.

Murdoch's legacy reminds us that great ideas often begin with simple questions and a passion for learning. At our school, we aim to nurture that same spirit in every child - encouraging them to explore, create, and persevere. By fostering a love of learning and a belief in their own potential, we hope our pupils will follow in Murdoch's footsteps and become confident, thoughtful individuals ready to make a difference. We realise each child is unique. We want our children to be successful, enjoy their time in school and feel safe and secure. We will work hard to ensure our children engage with their learning, collaborate with their peers and the teaching staff and uphold the school values of respect, effort, attitude, cooperation and honesty that we hold so dear.

At William Murdoch, we take pride in our school community and maintain high expectations for student uniform and conduct. We believe that this is a fundamental aspect of fostering a culture of high expectations and achievement. Therefore, we kindly request that all students wear full William Murdoch Primary School uniform every day. Regarding jewellery, the only permitted items are a pair of studs. Rings, bracelets, and necklaces should not be worn by students. In terms of footwear, students are required to wear black leather school shoes; trainers (except for Nursery where black trainers are allowed), canvas shoes, or boots are not permitted. On PE days, pupils can attend school in PE kit. However, children have already misplaced jumpers and cardigans and it is difficult to return them to who they belong to when they do not have their names in. Please add names to everything but especially blazers, jumpers, cardigans, PE hoodies and coats.



## Attendance

Attendance has been very good so far this term. Thank you for your help in making sure that your children attend school and arrive on time. Although we continue to maintain a soft start to the day, punctuality is vitally important. All school doors close at 8.50am. Any children arriving after that time will need to enter via the Main Office and will be signed in as late. Children undertake important learning first thing in the morning and it can be unsettling for children who arrive late. If your child is unable to attend school, it is extremely important that you inform the school of this before 9.00am on the day of absence. Please either email the school at [enquiry@williammurdoch.bham.sch.uk](mailto:enquiry@williammurdoch.bham.sch.uk) or leave a message on the absence line, giving your child's name, class and a brief reason for absence. If we are not informed of a reason for an absence, it will be recorded as unauthorised.

Please also arrive promptly to collect your child(ren) at the end of the day.

If your child is booked on a club and will not be attending for any reason, it is really important that you, and not your child, speak to a member of the office staff before the club is due to start. This is for safeguarding reasons. Thank you in advance for your cooperation and support.

## Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club is back up and running and we still have a small number of places available. The cost of this provision is £2.50 per day for the first child, and £1.00 per day for any additional children, and must be paid for in advance on a half-termly basis. ## Healthy Eating Reminders

### Healthy Snack Policy


Our school policy is that we encourage all children to have fresh fruit or vegetables at morning break time. Sweets, crisps, cheese strings, chocolate, crackers and items such as Fruit Winders are not permitted. Lower School children are provided with a snack but children in Upper School should bring a healthy fruit or vegetable snack to eat at morning break or parents can purchase toast from the canteen via ParentPay.

### Birthday Treats

Children are asked not to bring sweets / treats / cakes in to celebrate their birthdays as this leads to peer pressure, does not support our healthy school status and is challenging for pupils with allergies etc. Thank you for your support.

### Packed Lunch Policy

Parents and pupils are encouraged to send a healthy packed lunch. No fizzy drinks are permitted. Packed lunches should not contain any products containing nuts (peanut butter, Nutella / nut-based chocolate spreads, nut based cereal bars etc.) as we have a number of children in school with a severe nut allergy.



## Nursery and Reception

We have welcomed all of our Nursery and Reception children over the past two weeks. In the short time that they have been here, they have already made progress. Starting school can be a very difficult time for our youngest children but I am taken aback by how quickly they are settling into school routines. In Reception, the children are having fun making new friends and exploring a range of activities in the classroom. The children have been learning to write their name and have been exploring the early years environment. Children in Nursery are also making new friends and interacting well with a range of activities including singing nursery rhymes and action songs. We are incredibly proud of our early years provision and would welcome visits to the school for any parents who may be considering Nursery or Reception places in the future. ## School Photographs

The photographer will be in school on Tuesday 30 September 2025 to photograph the children in the Upper School. Family photos will be taken at 8.35am in the Upper School hall. If you would like a family photo, please bring your child straight to the Upper School hall at 8.35am and do not send them to class first. On Wednesday 1 October 2025, the photographer will photograph the children in the Lower School, including Nursery pupils. Throughout the days, individual, class and sibling photos will be taken. We will arrange for brothers and sisters in the Upper School and Lower School to be photographed together on either of these days. A letter will be sent to you nearer the time so you can let us know if you would like a sibling photo to be taken. **Please ensure that your child is in full school uniform. If your child has PE and is due to have their photograph taken, they must wear their full school uniform to school and bring their PE kit to school in their bag to change in to.**

## School Meals - ParentPay

From Reception to the end of Year 2, children are entitled to Universal Infant Free School Meals. From Year 3 upwards the cost of school lunches will be £2.30 per day. Families in receipt of certain benefits may be entitled to means-tested Free School Meals (FSM). If you think you might be eligible and have not yet applied, please contact the school office in confidence, or visit <https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/birmingham> for eligibility details and to apply online. Even if your child does not take the free meals up, or is currently having free meals because of their age, his/her entitlement to FSM will attract additional funding to the school. Please do apply if you think you might be eligible.




**For children who have moved up to Year 3 from September 2025, please remember that Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) stops at the end of Year 2. The cost of school meals for Year 3 upwards will be £2.30 per day.**

**We ask that parents settle all Parent Pay outstanding balances by Friday 26 September 2025.** We will continue to chase any outstanding payments until they have been paid in full. The school operates a No Debt Policy with regard to school meals; however, families are well-informed and supported through the process.

## Breaktime Snacks

A morning breakfast toast facility is available to all pupils from Year 3 to Year 6. Payment for toast can only be made through your child's ParentPay account. Toast must be purchased in full for each half-term priced at:

Toast	£6.00 per half-term (20p per day)
Cheese on Toast	£12.00 per half-term (40p per day)

Payment for toast must be made by the first Friday of each half-term. Fruit is also available for all Lower School pupils, including the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS), during morning break free of charge.




## After-School Clubs


## WMPS Attendance Stats

#### Follow the Swallow – *Julia Donaldson & Thomas Docherty (illustrator)*





### Nursery children


